1 Agreement

The successful bidder will be expected to sign the Contract Form (Part 1) of this bid document within 30 days of the date of notification by the Eden District Municipality that his/her bid has been accepted.

2 Completion of Bid Documents

3 Alteration or Qualification of Bid

No unauthorised alteration of this set of bid documents will be allowed. Any unauthorised alteration will disqualify the proposal automatically. Any ambiguity has to be cleared with contact person for the bid before the closure date.

4 Authorised Signatory

- (a) A copy of the recorded Resolution taken by the Board of Directors, members, partners or trustees authorising the representative to submit this bid on the bidder's behalf must be attached to the Bid Document on submission of same.
- (b) A bid shall be eligible for consideration only if it bears the signature of the bidder or of some person duly and lawfully authorised to sign it for and on behalf of the bidder.

7 Tax Clearance Certificate



TERMS OF REFERENCE

Scope:

The garment is designed to be worn by wild-land (veld & bush) firefighters, providing adequate protection from open flames and radiant heat. The Wild land fire fighting garment has to adhere to the following criteria:

Standards and Design:

Adhere to EN 15614

"EN 15614:2007: Performance requirements for wild-land firefighting clothing."

Or

Adhere to NFPA 1977 and meets the criteria for the required firefighting apparel as described in the code.
 "This Wildland Fire fighting Protective (Garment, Helmet, Glove, or Footwear) meets the (Garment, Helmet, Glove, Footwear, or Face/Neck Shroud) requirements of NFPA 1977, Standard on Protective Clothing and Equipment for Wild land fire fighting, 1998 Edition."

2. Certification:

- The manufacturer must produce and include certification stating compliance to standards for all material and construction used in the manufacturing of the required grass and wild land fire fighting personal protective clothing.
- 2) The material specifications standards must be stated on the label, which must be attached to jacket as well as the trousers.


