- * One Stop Facilities that have been introduced as a critical part of SA's anti-rape strategy aiming to reduce secondary victimization, improve conviction rates and improve the cycle time for finalisation of cases.



> Thuthuzela Care Centres were created as one-stop facilities that operate as a critical part of South Africa's anti-rape strategy aimed at reducing secondary trauma for the victim, improving perpetrators' conviction rates and reducing the time it takes to finalise criminal cases.

> The centre, which is on call 24 hours a day, is staffed by a nursing practitioner, medical doctor, social worker, dedicated case monitor, victim assistance officer as well as a police officer to provide a safe environment for traumatised persons. A comprehensive service that includes a medical examination, counselling, statement taking and investigations are provided to the victims of sexual

> Western Cape Minister of Health Theuns Botha said, "The 16 Days of Activism for no violence against women and children campaign runs from 25 November to 10 December. It is important that our citizens are aware of the places where they can get help. It is also critical that everyone takes responsibility for stopping the abuse of women and children. Men must honour and respect women and take care of them; treating them with dignity and respect.'
