- There is a 52% district increase in new cases over the last 7 days compared to 7-14 days ago;
- Sub-district increases are for all except Bitou, Hessequa and Kannaland;
- Particular sub-districts that are focused on now are Oudtshoorn, George and Mossel Bay;
- The positive cases are still coming from widespread areas throughout the local municipal areas (There have been no clear clusters);
- This is an adverse development for the district;
- All situations are being actively monitored by our EHP's and DoH.

- There are now 38 active cases per 100 000. (One week ago it was 35.)
- The situation has improved slightly for Hessequa, Kannaland and even Mossel Bay compared to the previous week;
- Oudtshoorn and then George once again have the highest active cases per 100 000 people;
- (And Oudtshoorn has gone up from 52 to 54, and George has gone up from 41 to 50);
- The Western Cape as a whole has a lower value than the Garden Route has.
