BID CONDITIONS AND INFORMATION

1 Agreement

The successful bidder will be expected to sign the Contract Form (Part 1) of this bid document within 30 days of the date of notification by the Garden Route District Municipality that his/her bid has been accepted.

2 Completion of Bid Documents

- (a) The original bid document must be completed fully in black ink and signed by the authorised signatory to validate the proposal. All the pages must be initialled by the authorised signatory. Failure to do so may result in the invalidation of the bid.
- (b) Bid documents may not be retyped or altered in any way.

3 Alteration or Qualification of Bid

No unauthorised alteration of this set of bid documents will be allowed. Any unauthorised alteration will disqualify the proposal automatically. Any ambiguity has to be cleared with contact person for the bid before the closure date.

4 Authorised Signatory

- (a) A copy of the recorded Resolution taken by the Board of Directors, members, partners or trustees authorising the representative to submit this bid on the bidder's behalf must be attached to the Bid Document on submission of same.
- (b) A bid shall be eligible for consideration only if it bears the signature of the bidder or of some person duly and lawfully authorised to sign it for and on behalf of the bidder.

5 Submission of Bid

- (a) The bid must be put in a sealed envelope, or envelopes when the two-envelope system is specified, clearly marked with the bid number, title as well as closing date and time and placed in the *Tender Box* at the Garden Route District Municipality by not later than 11h00 on 22 July 2022.
- (b) Faxed, e-mailed and late bids will not be accepted. Bids may be delivered by hand, by courier, or posted at the bidder's risk and must be received by the deadline specified above, irrespective of how they are sent or delivered.

6 Opening, Recording and Publications of Bids Received.

- Bids will be opened in public immediately after the bid closure date, or at such
- time as specified in the bid documents. If requested by any bidder present,
- names of the bidders, and if practical the total amount of each bid and of any alternative bids will be read out aloud.
- Bids received in time recorded and entered in a register which is open for public inspection.

7 Tax Clearance Certificate

- a. A valid original Tax Clearance Certificate must accompany the bid documents.

 <u>The onus is on the bidder to ensure that the Garden Route District Municipality has an original Tax Clearance Certificate on record</u> and obtain confirmation from the Supply Chain Management Unit of the Garden Route District Municipality.
- b. Bids not supported by a valid original Tax Clearance Certificate, as an attachment to the bid documents will be invalidated.
- c. In bids where consortia/joint ventures/sub-contractors are involved; each party must submit a separate valid original Tax Clearance Certificate.

8 Evaluation of Bids

Bids will be evaluated in terms of their responsiveness to the bid specifications and requirements as well as such additional criteria as set out in the bid documents.

9 Acceptance or Rejection of a Bids

The Garden Route District Municipality reserves the right to withdraw any invitation to submit a bid and/or to readvertise or to reject any bid or to accept a part of it. The Garden Route District Municipality does not bind itself to accepting the lowest bid.

10 Registration on Accredited Supplier Database

It is expected of all prospective service providers who are not yet registered on the Central Supplier Database to register online (www.csd.gov.za) and verify their company information at Garden Route District Municipality Database Department. The Garden Route District Municipality reserves the right not to award proposals to prospective suppliers who are not registered on the CSD (Central Supplier Database).

11 Site / Information Meetings

No site meeting.

12 Stamp and Other Duties

The successful bidder will be liable for all duties and costs on legal documents resulting in the establishment of a contract and for the surety and retentions.

13 Language of Contract

The contract documents will be compiled in English and the English versions of all referred documents will be taken as applicable.

14 Procurement Policy

Bids will be awarded in accordance with the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, No 5 of 2000.

15 Expenses Incurred in Preparation of Bid

The Garden Route District Municipality shall not be liable for any expenses incurred in the preparation and submission of the bid.

16 Wrong Information Furnished

Where a contract has been awarded on the strength of the information furnished by the bidder which, after the conclusion of the relevant agreement, is proved to have been incorrect, the Garden Route District Municipality may, in addition to any other legal remedy it may have, recover from the contractor all costs, losses or damages incurred or sustained by the Municipality as a result of the award of the contract.

17 Validity Period

Bids shall remain valid for 120 days after the bid closure date.

18 General and Special Conditions of Contract

The General Conditions of Contract as well as any Special Conditions of Contract that may form part of this set of bid documents will be applicable to this bid in addition to the conditions of bid.

19 Municipal Rates, Taxes and Charges

The bidder to provide their municipal account of rates and taxes of both the Bidding entity and its directors' in its Bid Document submission. Any bidder which is or whose directors are in arrear with their municipal rates and taxes due to any Municipality within South Africa for more than three months and have not made an arrangement for settlement of or same before the bid closure date will be disqualified.

20 Contact with Municipality after Bid Closure Date

Bidders shall not contact the Garden Route District Municipality on any matter relating to their bid from the time of the opening of the bid to the time the contract is awarded. If a bidder wishes to bring additional information to the notice of the Garden District Municipality, it should do so in writing to the Garden Route District Municipality. Any effort by the firm to influence the Garden Route District Municipality in the bid evaluation, bid comparison or contract award decisions may result in the rejection of the bid.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

BACKGROUND

The Garden Route District Municipality in collaboration with its partners, Cape-Nature, SAN-Parks, Mountain to Ocean (MTO) and PG Bisson, make provision for aerial firefighting resources in the Garden Route District during the winter season from April to November of every year. In order to make this costly resource affordable to the district, it was agreed by all the role players, to enter into an agreement to follow a transversal tender process to procure this service that will be available to any of the partners for aerial firefighting if needed.

Scope

Roll players in partnership

Garden Route District Municipality (GRDM), Cape-Nature, SAN-Parks, Mountain to Ocean (MTO) and PG Bisson

TIME FRAME

Year 1 – April to November 2023

Year 2 - April to November 2024

Rear 3 - April to November 2025

SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. Service Providers must be an accredited aerial support service provider who is fully registered with the South African Civil Aviation Authority (SACAA) as a licenced operator to perform G8 fire spotting, control and fighting and G15 under sling and winching services. The valid Aircraft Operators Certificate must be in the name of the bidder and must be submitted with the Tender. Failure to submit a valid operator's certificate will result in disqualification of the bid.
- 2. The minimum capacity of the bambi-bucket(s) including the fire retardant must be 800 litres.
- **3.** From time to time the helicopter(s) will also be used for trooping which may include inaccessible areas or reconnaissance and must be able to accommodate a minimum of five personnel at a time.
- **4.** Type of helicopters and water carrying capacity of the bambi bucket and trooping capacity must be indicated and included in the bid proposals of prospective service providers.
- 5. The helicopter(s) must for the duration of the time frame be stationed at a landing base in the George area of the Garden Route District, the location thereof to be approved by the partners. Deviation of this proviso may only be undertaken with the approval of the partners. The initial ferry cost to place the aircraft in George is the service provider's responsibility.

- **6.** The helicopter(s) must be available for the whole area of the Garden Route District, as well as the areas just outside of the Garden Route district, that forms part of the Cape-Nature and SAN Parks reserves on the North, West and East of the border between Garden route district and surrounding.
- **7.** The relationship between the partners and the successful tenderer will respectively be that of client and independent contractor. No employment relationship will exist between them.
- **8.** The successful tenderer shall affect in its name policies of insurance to cover public liability, insurance in the amount of at least R20 000 000, 00 and provide the partners with a copy of such policy on submission of their tenders as proof that the required insurance is in place.
- **9.** Notwithstanding any other condition, the risk, obligations, liabilities and responsibilities in providing the service will remain with the Service Provider.
- **10.** The partners shall be indemnified from and shall not accept any liability whatsoever in regard to any loss of life, injury or damage, caused either deliberately or negligently by the Service Provider or his employees, rendering the service.
- 11. Service provider must be available on cell-phone and or landline 24 hours per day and be able to provide helicopter(s) and dedicated qualified crew and technicians/engineers to be on standby according to the forecasts and actual Fire Danger Index (FDI), on a daily basis. The Service Provider shall at all times ensure that the following standby requirements are met:

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General Conditions of Contract

1. Definitions
